Ohio law outlines the uses for <u>Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid</u> and <u>Student Wellness and Success Funds.</u> For Fiscal Years 2024 and 2025, districts and schools are required to use funding to support the initiatives outlined in the following table. **Districts and schools must use at least 50% of SWSF for mental health services or physical health care services or a combination of both.** 

Initiatives that may be funded with Student Wellness and Success Funding are marked with a green circle and initiatives that may be funded with Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid are marked with a blue square. If an initiative is marked with both a green circle and a blue square, either funding source may be used.
